How to Use the Liturgy for Morning Prayer

Intro: I am excited that you have decided to give this morning liturgy a shot. Most of the liturgy is intuitive but some needs a little explanation. In terms of what to expect, the liturgy will normally take me between 15 and 45 minutes to complete (depending upon how much time you have to spend in prayer). I normally do the liturgy by myself, but when I do it with others, we will typically alternate each section and pray the red boxes together.

Below is a section-by-section guide to using Morning Liturgy on your own! (some are left blank if no explanation is needed):

ADDRESS: I recommend a bit of silence before you start to center yourself and to try and set aside whatever is on your mind.

FIRST PRAYERS: The (Hallelujah) is to be omitted during the liturgical season of Lent (between Ash Wednesday & Easter)

JESUS PRAYER: The phrase [a sinner] is only prayed the first time. Every time after when the Jesus Prayer is prayed you end with the word "me."

CONFESSION OF SIN: The plural pronoun here is used on purpose. Even when we are praying alone, we use the word "we" to highlight how we are unified with one another in our collective need for God's grace.

PSALM OF THE DAY: I try to work through the Psalms 1 at a time or you can follow the Book of Common Prayer daily readings. Here is a helpful <u>link</u> to the Psalm and Gospel reading of the day.

GOSPEL READING (REVISED COMMON LECTIONARY): Just like the last section, you will need to use the Book of Common Prayer for this section as well. The Gospel reading is always at the bottom of this <u>link</u>.

APOSTLES CREED

JESUS PRAYER

PSALM 23

PSALM 91:1-2

PRAYER FOR FAMILY: This is a time for you to "freestyle" pray for your immediate family (i.e. mom, dad, siblings, spouse, children, etc)

LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For yours is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

JESUS PRAYER

LORD'S PRAYER (EXPANDED): This is a time for you to spend some extended time praying through the petitions of the Lord's Prayer. For example, you might start with the first petition (*Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name*) and spend some time thanking God for his fatherly love and care. Then you might move to the second petition and spend some time praying for God's kingdom to come in Durham as it is in heaven. The idea is to take a few minutes praying the Lord's prayer back to God.

PETITION AND INTERCESSION: This is a time for you offer up any petitions that God has laid on your heart. The idea of this liturgy is that we draw near to guard first, and are reminded of who He is and what He is about, before we begin offering up our own requests to him.

CONTEMPLATION (SITTING WITH JESUS): This is a time for you to sit silently and listen to what the Lord might be speaking to you. I normally set an alarm for a designated amount of time so that I don't find myself watching a clock (maybe start out with 5 minutes and see if you might want to grow this section over time). I will often have a phrase in mind, like the Jesus prayer, that I will recite when I find my mind wandering and I'm getting distracted.

PRAYER TO THE CRUCIFIED CHRIST: After the contemplation, the liturgy now shifts to an outward focus. After having been with Jesus, we are now being sent out into the word to be his ambassadors, bringing the good news of the Gospel to a lost and broken world.

THE BEATITUDES:

Matthew 5:2-11

And he opened his mouth and taught them, saying:³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.⁴ "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.⁵ "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.⁶ "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.⁷ "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy.⁸ "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.⁹ "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons^{III} of God.¹⁰ "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.¹¹ "Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. ¹² Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK: Here again you need the Book of Common Prayer to help you. These are ancient prayers that are written for various weeks of the year. Here is a link to all of the weekly prayers (called "collects") for the year. This may feel like a tedious step to look these up each day so you may want to pass on this section. However, the prayers are so incredibly rich if you can get the hang of using the Book of Common Prayer.

A LITURGY FOR MORNING PRAYER

Address
